

Logistics

At first glance Telehealth looks pretty simple. A patient comes to a GP with a problem. The GP decides a specialist referral is required. Distance, mobility or access issues suggest Telehealth.

But what are the logistics?

The GP needs to:

- 1) find a Specialist willing to offer a Telehealth appointment
- 2) make a booking
- 3) send a referral to the Specialist
- 4) negotiate a suitable connection mechanism
- 5) make sure the patient is seen and appropriately followed up

The Specialist needs to:

- 1) offer Telehealth appointments
- 2) get referrals
- 3) take bookings
- 4) negotiate a suitable connection mechanism
- 5) connect and perform the consult
- 6) bill a patient who is not physically present by either:
 - * Bulk billing Medicare with DB4 assignment of benefits
 - * privately billing with invoicing +/- credit card handling
- 7) communicate treatment plans back to the GP

Wouldn't it be great if there was a single solution to all of these issues?
